

Star fruit: Homemade Korean Food

his new restaurant located in the Mango Moon Hotel will provide a unique taste experience to those who appreciate exotic food. Fran, the owner, was born and raised in South Korea. She traveled to New York to study and then lived for a time in Boston.

In 2018, she came to Costa Rica and was given the opportunity to buy the Mango Moon Hotel with a partner. At that time the hotel was in need of some updates and their idea was to fix it up and sell it again. After some time in Manuel Antonio and at the end of the Pandemic, she realized that she had fallen in love with the place, so she decided to buy her partner's share and stay.

Mango Moon already had a restaurant on its premises and Fran decided to restyle it as a Korean restaurant, using what she knew from her native country. So, in November of 2023 she opened her rebranded restaurant, calling it **Carambola.** The name is inspired by the beautiful carambola fruit tree at the hotel's back patio. They use the fruit in cocktails, smoothies and as decoration on dishes and drinks.

Fran's goal is to introduce Costa Ricans and the world to authentic Korean home cooking. Fresh, local ingredients are combined with three imported Korean essentials to achieve the traditional flavors of Korea: Bean Paste, Pepper Paste, Pepper Powder.

Come and try Kimchi, the traditional fermented cabbage dish, or tantalize your taste buds with a traditional barbecue, prepared at your table by the chef. **Carambola** offers a peaceful, pleasant atmosphere and panoramic mountain and ocean views. Entrees are priced between \$18 and \$39. Open to the public 7 days a week from 1 to 10 pm. Mango Moon Hotel is located 300 meters west of Banco Promerica, Manuel Antonio. Evervone is welcome.

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
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The Gecko Poop Hypothesis

his was a question I never planned to navigate when I moved here 4 years ago. A fellow recent immigrant approached me. He was an expert on everything because he had been here a few months longer.

"You need to call an exterminator to kill the geckos in your house. They will make you sick," he told me, "I know a guy."

I love the geckos. As a biologist I thought there were good, they eat the bad things. He further explained, "No, their poop can make you sick. They will poop everywhere. They poop on your plates, on your counters where you cook. They can poop in your mouth while you sleep, it will make your sick."

What spoke of was salmonella. It is correct, reptiles often carry salmonella. I responded as the insufferable nerd I am. I told him I never heard of this theory, but I would investigate. My concern for aggressive fumigation is that geckos will go outside and get ingested by monkeys, hurting the titis and howlers. They feed the basilisks that hang out near our pool. The geckos eat the vectors that spread other diseases. Pesticides are effective but they must be used wisely.

I didn't know the answer. I reached out to experts. As a nerd, I have nerd friends. Armed with the gecko poop hypothesis I reached out to two people that know more. One, Erin, is a reptile biologist. She knows reptiles and frogs, and works with the USGS. The other, Anna, is a veterinary microbiologist working with diseases jumping from other animals into humans. She is at CSU but also has worked with the CDC.

I explained to them both the gecko poop hypothesis. They understood the facets: risk of disease, geckos, dead monkeys, dead basilisks, and possible human misconceptions. They spent some time with their research associates to find what the peer reviewed research indicates regarding the gecko poop hypothesis. Everyone first laughed at this research question. Then they also agreed we didn't know.

They found peer reviewed research on this very thing. It was done because the gecko poop hypothesis is everywhere. With the help of the World Health Organization experts determined how much salmonella is in gecko poop, the "abundance." Based on abundance they determined how much gecko poop you need to ingest daily to be at risk of salmonella. It is about two measuring cups, two mouthfuls, ingested daily. So, yes, you can get salmonella from geckos. But you really need to put some effort into it.

The research continued to point out the beneficial impacts of the geckos were far greater than the minimal risk of salmonella. It is better to keep the geckos as they reduce the abundance of those other vectors like cockroaches, assassin bugs, and mosquitoes.

Delighted I shared the research with my fellow immigrant. "I don't believe your research, it is wrong," he said as he walked away. Maybe he was mad he wouldn't get a commission.

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

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

osta Rica's Caribbean Coast is a unique travel destination, it is like traveling to another world, in terms of its Afro-Caribbean culture and its ecological biodiversity. This verdant coast along the eastern side of the Talamanca Mountain range, has beautiful rainforests, abundant wildlife and great cultural diversity.

The South Caribbean, which includes beaches like Cahuita, Puerto Viejo, Cocles and Manzanillo, are absolutely stunning. Fortunately, the development bug hasn't caught on here as much as the rest of the country, so it is a very pleasant atmosphere that captures a culture as it has been for decades. Historically, the LGBT community has always been present in this area, especially in Puerto Viejo, Playa Negra, Cocles, Punta Uva and Manzanillo.

Since 2019, Pride in Puerto Viejo has been organized by Antonio Caputo (Toni). Toni is originally from Berlin, who's lived in Puerto Viejo since 14 years. Toni performed as a Drag King in Germany, Europe and the the US. Now organizes Queer events under the name of Sea Breeze Events Costa Rica in Puerto Viejo.

Inspired by Pride San José, they decided to start organizing Pride events in Puerto Viejo.

With the slogan: We are Queer and we are here. Pride & Diversity, One Human - No separation. Love is Love.

Stashu's Con Fusión Restaurant Food for the soul!

Stash Golas is originally from Guyana but also lived in Trinidad and Tobago and Toronto. Being the eldest of 5 kids, with a single mom in the Caribbean, he had the obligation to do the cooking and that is where he discovered his passion: owning a restaurant. He arrived in Puerto Viejo 31 years ago, to help a friend who had a restaurant for high season. He later opened his own establishment, inspired by Indian-Caribbean-Asian fusion cuisine, 22 years ago. Stachu's was the first business to host the Gay Pride in Puerto Viejo. Stash strongly believes in supporting all members of the community.

Joaquin (Spain) and Hans (Holland) came to visit Costa Rica in 2007 and, like so many visitors, they fell in love with the country. The following year they returned and visited the Caribbean and discovered that the Caribbean had something very special, an authentic and unique energy. Everything seemed to fall in place for them to move to Costa Rica and they bought property in 2014 and moved permanently in 2018. In 2021 they built their home and two rental villas. They were inspired by Caribbean style architecture with its open concept and integration with the jungle with minimal alteration of the environment. They welcome guests to very comfortable and practical spaces. Each villa has a large terrace, a fully equipped kitchen, a room with air conditioning and a full bath.
